

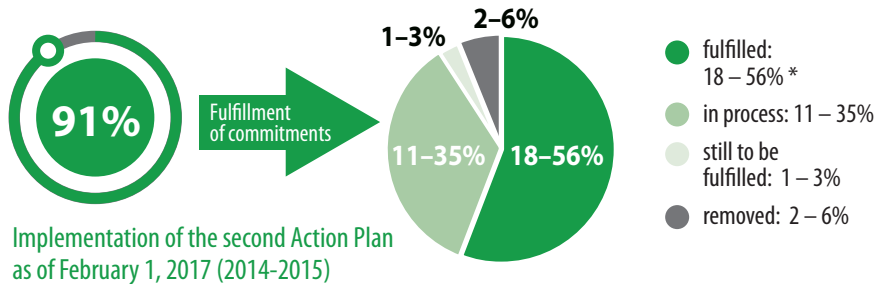
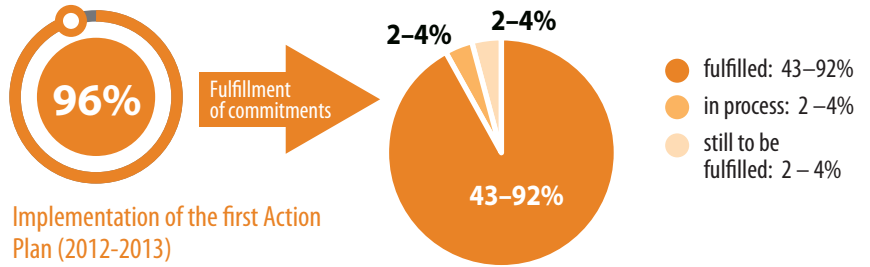
OPEN GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP

Open Government Partnership, OGP, is a multilateral international initiative, formally launched on September 20, 2011 during the session of the United Nations General Assembly; it includes 75 countries. Ukraine joined the global initiative in September 2011.

In 2015 Ukraine joined the joint Declaration on Open Government for the Implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

In 2016 Ukraine joined a collective action of Paris Declaration.

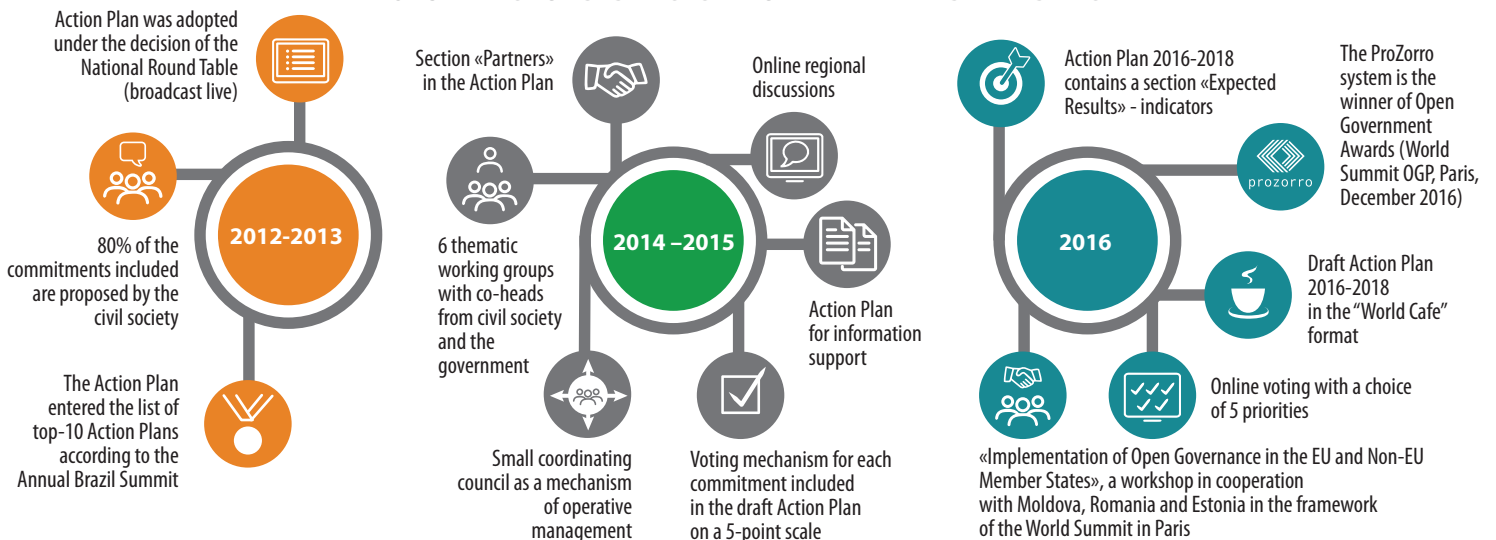
